this 14th century text for those starting on the path to a contemplative life offers a prayerful approach to transcending the cloud of unknowing that separates people from god

contains the cloud of unknowing the mystical theology of saint denis the book of privy counselling and an epistle on prayer against a tradition of devotional writings which focussed on knowing god through christ s passion and his humanity these texts describe a transcendent god who exists beyond human knowledge and human language these four texts are at the heart of medieval mystical theology in their call for contemplation calm and above all love as the way to understand the divine

the cloud of unknowing and the book of privy counseling are the first explorations in the english language of the soul s quest for god written in middle english by an unknown fourteenth century mystic the cloud of unknowing expresses with beauty a message that has inspired such great religious thinkers as st john of the cross and teilhard de chardin as well as countless others in search of god offering a practical guide to the life of contemplation the author explains that ordinary thoughts and earthly concepts must be buried beneath a cloud of forgetting while our love must rise toward a god hidden in the cloud of unknowing the book of privy counseling also included in this volume is a short and moving text on the way to enlightenment through a total loss of self and a consciousness only of the divine william johnston an authority on fourteenth century mysticism and spirituality provides an accessible discussion of the works detailing what is known about the history of the texts and their author in a new foreword huston smith draws on his extensive knowledge of the varieties of religious experience to illuminate the relevance of these works for contemporary readers

the cloud of unknowing was the work of an unknown 14th century english writer with a powerful message of god s unconditional love in the face of despair johnston s theological treatment of this and other works by the same writer makes a conscious comparison with oriental ways of contemplation

in the fourteenth century there was a great flourishing of religious writings in english both orthodox and heretical many of these works focused on christ s passion and humanity whereas the cloud of unknowing describes an abstract transcendent god beyond human knowledge and human language drawing upon radically different traditions it is a rich work full of intriguing contradictions that speaks to us with liveliness and wit even today the unknown author thought to be a priest and carthusian monk is also believed to have written the other three works in this volume the mystical theology of saint denis the book of privy counselling and an epistle on prayer which together with the cloud of unknowing are the four texts at the core of medieval mystical theology this penguin classics edition includes full explanatory notes suggestions for further reading an appendix that reproduces the middle english text of a section of the mystical theology of saint denis and an introduction that places the texts within the context of medieval religious writing for more than seventy years penguin has been the leading publisher of classic literature in the english

2014 reprint of 1952 revised edition full facsimile of the original edition the cloud of unknowing is an anonymous work of christian mysticism written in middle english in the latter half of the 14th century along with the cloud were written six accompanying treatises chief among these is epistle of privy counsel which is also reproduced in this text the cloud is a spiritual guide on contemplative prayer the underlying message of this work proposes that the only way to truly know god is to abandon all preconceived notions and beliefs or knowledge about god and be courageous enough to surrender your mind and ego to the realm of unknowingness at which point you begin to glimpse the true nature of god the book counsels a young student to seek god not through knowledge and intellection faculty of the human mind but through intense contemplation motivated by love and stripped of all thought this is brought about by putting all thoughts and desires under a cloud of forgetting and thereby piercing god s cloud of unknowing with a dart of longing love from the heart this form of contemplation is not directed by the intellect but involves spiritual union with god through the heart

written anonymously the cloud of unknowing is a treatise which discusses the human soul and how god interacts with it to form

each person's spiritual journey a manual of prayer and god split into seventy five short chapters this book is intended to be read slowly so that the author's comprehension is maximized first written in middle english during the 15th century the words are archaic but made comprehensible by author evelyn underhill who performed edits upon the original text in the early 20th century unusually for the period this treatise is imbued with plentiful good humor and a gentle tone the author does not seek to preach oppressively or with threats of damnation but instead offers readers a relaxed thoughtful yet devoted manual of faith and advice on living a joyous spiritually mindful life although the book is old the wisdom and guidance it offers is imbued with timelessness evelyn underhill an author who wrote extensively on the subjects of mysticism and spiritual experiences was fascinated by this surviving work of the late middle ages it was apparently written as private advice between a pupil and master and was not intended for wide publication underhill explains her affinity to this text in her introduction identifying it as a prime example of christian mysticism and noting past examples wherein mystics and spiritualists have influenced christianity

the christian mystical tradition has its roots in holy scripture but was enunciated most clearly by the late 5th century author writing under the name dionysius the areopagite it was acquaintance with the medieval version of that work which inspired the anonymous author of the cloud of unknowing and led him to develop his insights and perceptions of the obscurity and unknowability of god his understanding was that god was on an entirely different plane of existence from human beings indeed so different that time bound human language was inadequate to describe god exhaustively or accurately intellect and emotion both fail in seeking god who can only be encountered by rejecting of all common earthly means in a cloud of forgetting and the discovery of godself in the dark cloud of unknowing which can be pierced only with a lance of longing love

through knowledge and intellection faculty of the human mind but through intense contemplation motivated by love and stripped of all thought this text is still used in most courses that explore the experience of god called mysticism and still attracts contemporary spiritual seekers so it s really about moving from the intellect to the heart excerpt chapter three how the work of this book shall be wrought and of the worthiness of it before all other works lift up thine heart unto god with a meek stirring of love and mean himself and none of his goods and thereto look the loath to think on aught but himself so that nought work in thy wit nor in thy will but only himself and do that in thee is to forget all the creatures that ever god made and the works of them so that thy thought nor thy desire be not directed nor stretched to any of them neither in general nor in special but let them be and take no heed to them this is the work of the soul that most pleaseth god all saints and angels have joy of this work and hasten them to help it in all their might all fiends be furious when thou thus dost and try for to defeat it in all that they can all men living in earth be wonderfully holpen of this work thou wottest not how yea the souls in purgatory be eased of their pain by virtue of this work thyself art cleansed and made virtuous by no work so much and yet it is the lightest work of all when a soul is helped with grace in sensible list and soonest done but else it is hard and wonderful to thee for to do let not therefore but travail therein till thou feel list for at the first time when thou dost it thou findest but a darkness and as it were a cloud of unknowing thou knowest not what saving that thou feelest in thy will a naked intent unto god this darkness and this cloud is howsoever thou dost betwixt thee and thy god and letteth thee that thou mayest neither see him clearly by light of understanding in thy reason nor feel him in sweetness of love in thine affection and therefore shape thee to bide in this darkness as long as thou mayest evermore crying after him that thou lovest for if ever thou shalt feel him or see him as it may be here it behoveth always to be in this cloud in this darkness and if thou wilt busily travail as i bid thee i trust in his mercy that thou shalt come thereto

one's mind and ego to the realm of unknowing at which point one may begin to glimpse the nature of god this work became known to english catholics in the mid 17th century when later ascetic and benedictine mystic augustine baker 1575 1641 wrote an exposition on its doctrine today a transcript of this version of the work dated 1677 is at ampleforth college the original work itself however was not published until 1877 english mystic evelyn underhill edited an important version of the work in 1922
